## Dec 2 Hercules Returns

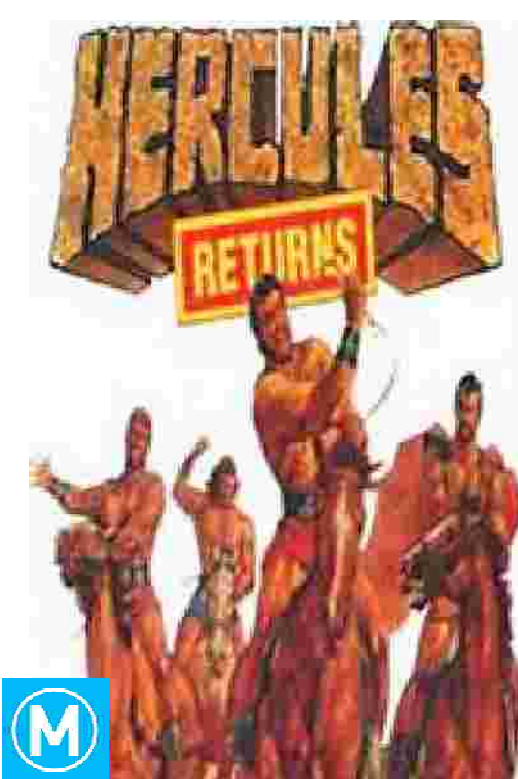
